SEQIP Overview 2024

Mission: advance acute stroke care management and reduce stroke disparities in Kentucky by:

- a) Establishing a network of professionals which will encourage and support collaboration among stroke care providers in Kentucky.
- b) Providing opportunities to share information and resources related to stroke program development and proficiency across the continuum of care in Kentucky.
- c) Promoting quality, improving outcomes and standardization of acute stroke care through collegiality and use of evidence-based practice guidelines.



SEQIP Goals

- a) To adopt evidence-based guidelines and standards for practice.
- b) To implement evidence-based integrated cerebrovascular systems of care.
- c) To support and advance the quality of care available to stroke patients in Kentucky.
- d) To share best practices and encourage collaboration among membership.
- e) To identify and map certified stroke centers in the state.
- f) To engage and recruit hospitals to seek certification as Comprehensive Stroke Center, Thrombectomy-Capable Stroke Center, Primary Stroke Center, and Acute Stroke Ready Center.
- g) Evaluate quality data and identify opportunities for improvement.
- h) To identify stakeholders and opportunities for collaboration with partners outside of SEQIP (examples, Kentucky Board of EMS, Kentucky Hospital Association, local health departments, etc.).
- i) Address the entire Stroke System of Care including pre-hospital stroke care, stroke rehabilitation and patient outcomes.
- j) Develop and disseminate an annual report to the Governor and Legislature, including recommendations for improving stroke system of care (KRS211.575 – Stroke Registry participation for certified stroke centers). Work in collaboration with the Kentucky Heart Disease and Stroke program (KDHP) to create and disseminate report.
- k) Support the passage of state policies that advance the implementation of a stroke systems of care.

EMS Outreach Committee Goals

Identify 2 EMS agencies annually by Kentucky area development district to participate in QI initiatives focused on evidence based prehospital stroke triage protocols

- Goal Completion Date: December 2024

Recruit 1 EMS person from each Kentucky Area Development District to participate in SEQIP leadership

- Goal Completion Date: December 2024

Maintain SEQIP representation on the KBEMS Cardiac & Stroke Subcommittee

- Goal Completion Date: Annually



EMS Outreach Committee Goals

Collaborate with HDSP and KBEMS to map travel time and distance to certified stroke centers to assist in the development of regional destination triage protocols to be completed and updated annually

- Goal Completion Date: December 2025

Recruit and implement process improvement initiatives in 2 health systems and 2 EMS agencies servicing those health systems annually to participate in core curriculum developed by SEQIP on acute treatment, documenting a stroke screening and severity scale in the field and hospitals prenotification for suspected stroke patients

- Goal Completion Date: December 2024

Identify & maintain documentation of EMS agencies by county and utilization of the KBEMS recommended stroke triage protocol versus use of medical director approved protocol

- Goal Completion Date: December 2024



EMS Outreach Committee Goals

Monitor by county and Kentucky Area Development District EMS documentation of a stroke screening scale, stroke severity scale, and prenotification.

Disseminate data to local EMS agencies and certified stroke centers they serve to develop PI plans specific to their region. Identify barriers to documentation and data collection.

Door In Door Out

- **Purpose:** *Initiative to focus on identification of barriers to timely transfers for emergent stroke presentations.*
- **Year 1 Goals:**
 - Each facility analyze DiDo baseline data and any collection of data improvements needed.
 - Review/Share best practices re: documentation/abstraction of barriers to timely transfers (GWTG). (ie develop EMR transfer items).
 - Collaborate and give written feedback to transferring facility ED, receiving facility, local EMS and air transport agencies on each emergent transfer DiDo times.
 - Create best practice(s) around transfer of emergency stroke patients.

 - Networking

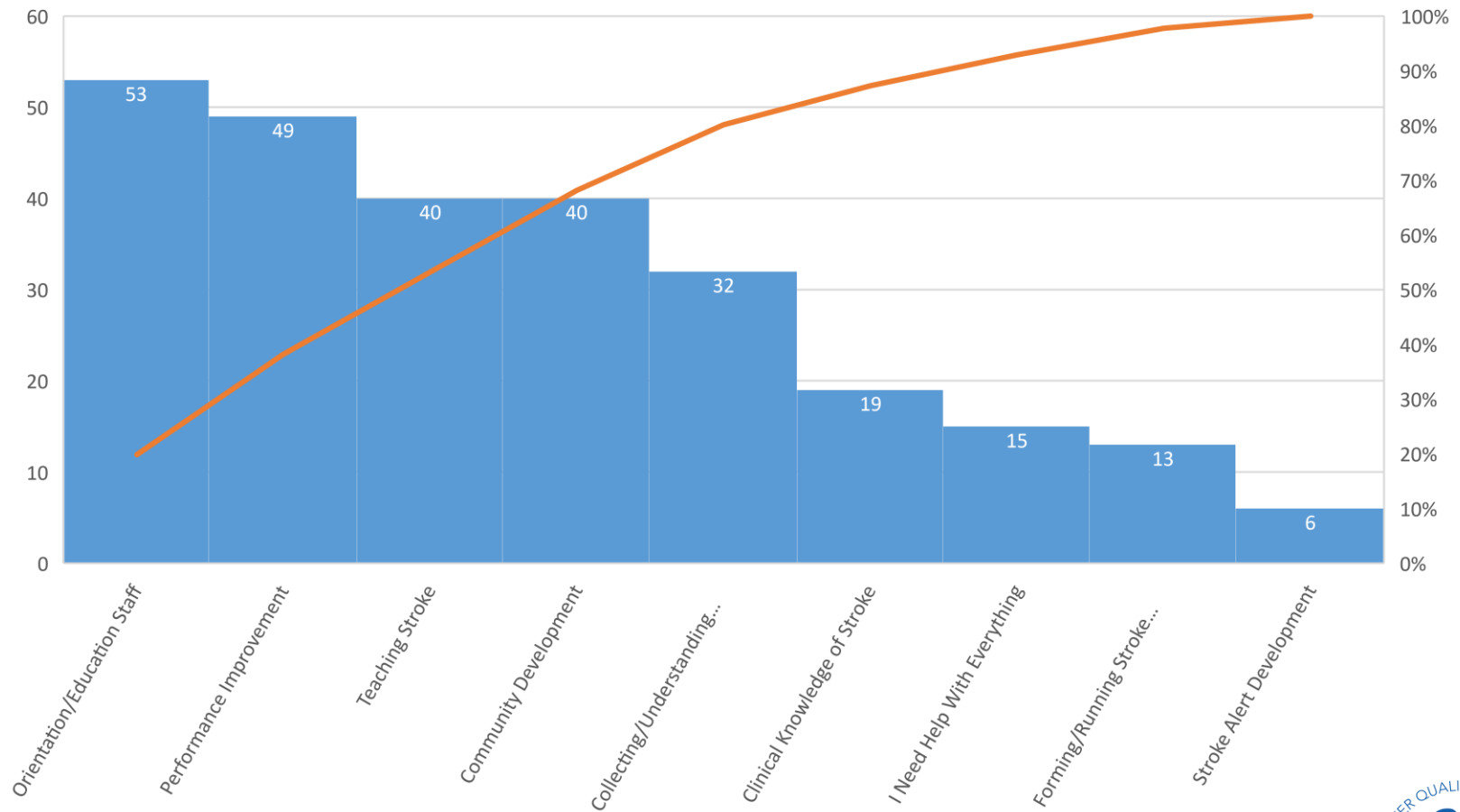


SPC Needs Assessment

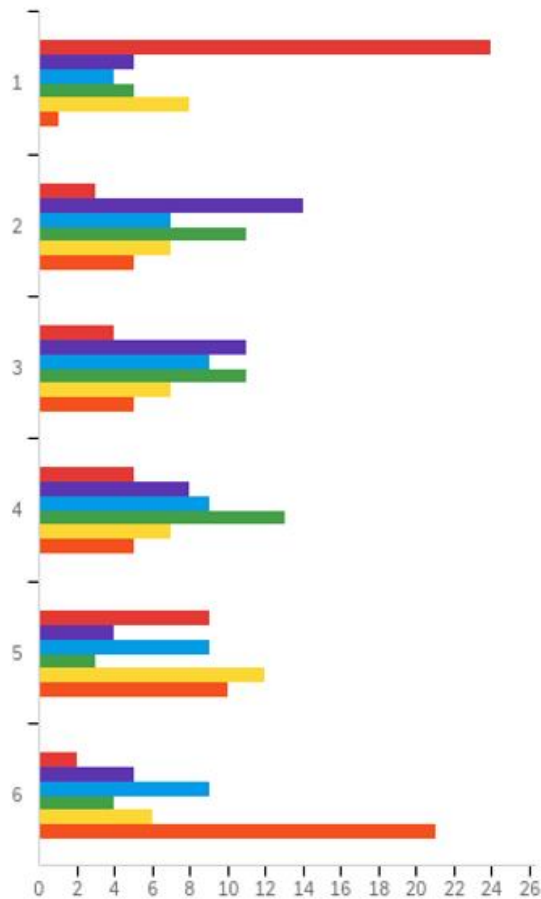
- Over the past six months the council has focused on a needs assessment and collecting information about SPCs in Kentucky.
- Survey results revealed
 - Over 40% had one year or less experience
 - Almost half had no formal orientation
 - Two-thirds had roles in addition to SPC
 - Over 40% had been “assigned” to the role

Next Steps

- Short-term Goals
 - Identify stroke programs with best practices in identified topics of need (staff education, performance improvement, EMS outreach, etc)
 - Deliver best practice education through SEQIP forum and other educational sessions
 - Development of resources and platform to house them so that new coordinators can access
- Long-Range Goals
 - Formal mentorship program to connect new SPCs with experienced SPCs
 - Development of stroke boot camps to provide orientation and professional development for SPCs

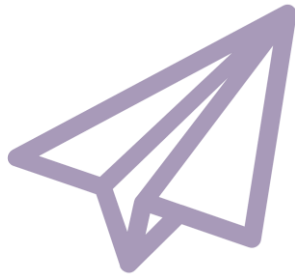
